THE CAMPAIGN IN ASIA MINOR.

TURKISH SUCCESS AT BATOUM—FIGHTING IN CIRCASSIAN RUSSIA, WITH THE RESULT AGAINST THE RUSSIANS.

CONSTANTINOPLE, July 1.—An official dispatch confirms the report that the Turks have captured the Samebah and Rhatzubani Heights before Batoum after a severe conflict.

LONDON, July 1.—It is reported that the Russians have suspended operations against Kars in order to reinforce the army fighting against the Turks at Soghanli and Bayazid.

A Constantinople dispatch says: "Fazli Pasha telegraphs from Soukgoum-Kaleh that the Turks, having landed at Tchamdjari and commenced to erect entrenchments, were on June 27 attacked by 15,000 Russians. Both sides were subsequently reinforced, the Turkish reinforcements arriving by sea from Batoum. The Turks with the assistance of iron-clads routed the Russians with the loss of 2,000 killed and 4,000 wounded. Ninety Turks were killed and 230 wounded. (!)
