

*THE OPERATIONS IN ASIA MINOR.*  
SHOCKING CONDITION OF BAYAZID—THE CIR-  
CASSIAN INSURRECTION.

LONDON, July 15.—Reuter's Telegram Company has received the following dispatch from St. Petersburg, dated to-day: "Gen. Ter-gukassoff reports that he found the town of Bayazid destroyed and the atmosphere so infected from dead bodies that it was impossible to remain in the place. From the scene of the insurrection in the Caucasus it is reported that the Russians have resumed the offensive. Gen. Alkhasoff marched on July 13 from Tokueli to Tkvartsheli, on the right bank of the Galigsi, drove the enemy from their entrenched positions, forced them behind Mokva, and occupied Goum.

Note.—Goum is about 20 miles north of Dukum; Soukgoum-Kaleh, seven.

LONDON, July 16.—The *Standard's* Constantinople dispatch says that Ismail Pasha has entered Russian territory and advanced six miles on the road to Tiflis.

The *Times* has received the following dispatch from Kars, July 12: "The Russians have fallen back from Batoum and it is rumored that the column will join Gen. Melikoff and again invade Armenia from Kuruk-Dara.
